## Submission of Papers

Original papers on the above sub-themes or related themes are invited from professionals. The papers should be based on research surveys, case studies or action plans. Surveys on Internet use/E-Journals Usage in libraries will not be accepted. Papers should not normally exceed 5,000 words or 16 double-spaced pages, besides tables, diagrams, etc. Also, each paper should contain an abstract, upto ten keywords, body of the paper, conclusion and references. The abstract should state in about 150 words the sum and substance of the paper. The conclusion should include the recommendations made in the paper. The keywords which describe the main issues discussed should be given in alphabetical order. The paper should also contain the author's name, designation, organisation, address, telephone, fax, and E-mail address. All references should be presented according to the Chicago Manual of Style ([http://www.chicagomanualofstyle.org/tools\\_citationguide.html](http://www.chicagomanualofstyle.org/tools_citationguide.html)). The following examples are cited from the Manual to ensure that the referencing model is strictly followed.

## HOW TO REACH KALABURAGI (GULBARGA)?

**Kalaburagi (Gulbarga) City** is well connected by Bus and Trains and nearest airport to reach Gulbarga is Hyderabad, just 220 km away and 613 km from Bangalore. Venue of the conference is about 10 km from Railway Station and Bus Stand. Climate would be around 18-25 degrees during the month of November, 2015.

## KALABURAGI (GULBARGA) – The Convention City

Gulbarga is an educational hub comprising of State and Central University, four Medical and two Dental Colleges, five Engineering Colleges and one Homeopathy and Ayurvedic Colleges and many Degree Colleges. It was the capital city of Bahamani kingdom and one of the most famous historic cities of Karnataka state with tourist attractions like Shri Sharanabasaveshwar Temple, Khaja Bande Nawaz Darga, Buddhavihar, Nagavi (the first University established), Mitakshara - Martur village (22 kms), Lord Dattatreya - Ganagapur (60 km), Basavakalyan (80 km), Gurunanak Jhira, Narasimha Jhira and the oldest Madarasa of Mohammed Gawan in Bidar (100 km), Golgumbaz in Bijapur (165 km), Mantralayam (200 kms) etc.

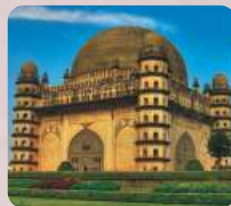
